- Identify a recommended approach and, if that involves any funding policy and/or regulatory barriers, identify those for government consideration.
- Build upon local partnerships and relationships but not be constrained by existing delegations of roles and responsibilities.

The goal of coordinated service planning is to improve service experiences and outcomes for families of children and youth with multiple and/or complex special needs through the support of a Service Planning Coordinator. Through its family centred approach, coordinated service planning may differ from one family to another because it will be designed to meet the unique needs of the children, youth and family serviced. Some families will benefit from the initial development of the coordinated service plan and the initial connections to a range of
3.			services while other families will benefit from more ongoing support for the Service Planning Coordinator, particularly around transitions, while still others may require a more intensive level of service coordination supports due to the complex nature of their child's needs and/or family situation.
