

Single Plan of Care Coordinator Role Description

The primary purpose of the Single Plan of Care Coordinator is to ensure service integration for children and their families with multiple special needs. There role is to:

- Facilitate an inter-agency team approach to the development and monitoring of a comprehensive integrated plan of care that is child and family centred
- Facilitate team development by understanding the network system: services, agencies and roles and making meaningful connections with and amongst team members
- Function as the 'guide' or resource to the Child and Family Team
 - Drive a common framework for building integrated goals thru facilitating the development of family visions
 - Lead providers to work as a team to support the family and the child's development; not just a reactionary team
 - Is accountable to the team to provide leadership and support around the use of the Single Plan of Care Process*
 - Ensures team accountability to the integrated plan and challenges team members to look at their agency mandates and policies that may be barriers to the operations of the plan
 - Have wide system and resource knowledge to assist in navigation
 - Regularly updates the team on family's strengths, needs and concerns to support the operations of the integrated plan
- Function as the 'guide' or one contact person for the family
 - Guides the family in the process of developing vision statements
 - Provides service navigation includes facilitating the referrals for identified services that the child and/or family wish to access
 - o Provide general information about services, events, and educational workshops available
 - Encourage parent advocacy skills by providing information and support in the context of the Child and Family Team
 - Provides brief family support around respite and funding
 - Connects with families on a regular basis to understand their strengths, needs and concerns as it pertains to the integrated plan of care

The Single Plan of Care Process* includes:

- Reading and/or contributing to the Child and Family Interview (CFI) information which functions as a Common Assessment Framework for the team
- Assisting parents in identifying their visions and prioritizing their goals
- Conducting an assessment of family strengths and needs as a follow up to the Child and Family Interview and providing an assessment summary which relate to the family's visions
- Navigates to and makes referrals for services/service providers that are not currently part of the Child and Family team

- Contacting the child's school and physician to explain the Single Plan Of Care process and discuss their involvement with the child's plan
- Providing information to team members who do not have access to the child's shared electronic record.
- Scheduling team meetings (including Single Plan of Care meetings) for the Child and Family team
- Leading the meetings for the Child and Family teams
- Assisting the team in developing integrated goals that reflect the family's visions
- Ensuring the Single Plan of Care is documented and monitored
- Documenting in the shared electronic-record for ongoing team and goal development for the child
- Providing families with printed copies of information from the shared electronic record

Recommended Skills/Experience for a Single Plan of Care Coordinator:

Strong:

- Assessment skills of a child and family's strengths and needs
- Interpersonal skills
- Communication skills written and verbal
- Leadership skills
- Team facilitation skills
- Problem solving skills
- Computer skills
- Conflict resolution or negotiation skills
- Knowledge of the broader social service system for children and families

Experience with:

- Families of children with multiple special needs
- Working with team members from multiple sectors (particularly school board personnel)
- A variety of provider agencies in York Region
- Goal writing; ideally, integrated goals

Able to work:

- With a team
- With minimal supervision
- In an evolving/changing system of service delivery
