## A Tip from Eva For Helping Children To Follow Directions

Before you ask your child to do something (especially when you are in a hurry) try the **"collect before you direct"** strategy. For example, if you are in a rush to leave the babysitters, remember to take a moment to:

- 1.Say hello.
- 2. Wait until your child looks at you before telling them to hurry.
- 3. Smile at them.
- 4. Try to get them to smile at you by saying something like, "you were having fun playing with your friends."
- 5. As you are both smiling at each other, let them know that it is time to quickly gather their things together.
- 6. If you can, make it playful: "let's see how fast we can get to the car."

When children are smiling with us, they are more naturally inclined to follow us. Collect before you direct: get their eyes, nod, and smile before giving a direction. Give it a try!

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
