What do families need at this time?	<ul> <li>Challenge: Covid and Group Homes- Lots of advocacy has been happening in this area. Families want recognition as being essential if their child lives in a group home setting.</li> <li>Success: Sibshop sessions were held virtually (90 mins). Lots of positive feedback. CTN will continue to support these together with partners. Possible idea to pace sessions like this for children with special needs. Maybe do something like this this year to replace park events?</li> <li>Challenge: School boards connecting with families. Families are finding inconsistencies across boards in how on-line learning is delivered. Requires families to adapt to make the learning accessible to children with special needs. Unique needs of the child do not appear to be considered. The amount of time over videoconference is not enough to be effective. Families expressed concern as to what September would look like. Will bring results back to FAC in June.</li> <li>Self-Advocacy workshop – this continues to be something FAC is interested in presenting.</li> <li>Karen Steele updated group on a meeting she had with the Family Service Navigator from Sunnybrook. Service is available to teens and adults (13-26 year olds) living in York, GTA and Durham. Involves brief screening over the phone. Involves public and private sector including 3 psychiatrists. Action: Karen will arrange to have the navigator attend our September meeting to inform the group of this service.
