What We Do

CTN supports children, youth and families by focusing on the <u>F-words for Child Development</u>. Every child with varying abilities has the right to have fun, enjoy friends, function as they are, access fitness, plan for their future and join in family activities like biking and hiking.

The Equipment Loan Program (ELP) provides access to specialized recreation, therapy and complex clinical equipment so children and youth with disabilities and developmental needs can participate with their family and friends at home and in the community. If your child is involved with an occupational therapist (OT) or physiotherapist (PT), speak to them first about which equipment would be most appropriate for your child

Therapy Equipment

Looking for small therapy equipment to support your child's daily living activities such as adapted bath seats, therapy balls for gross motor skills development, movin' sit cushions and hokki stools for mobility, positioning and seating and more? Look no further! Your child's therapist has access to a large database of loanable small therapy equipment stored at all CTN sites. This equipment can be borrowed for up to 12 weeks so you can try it with your child before deciding whether you should buy one.

Speak to your child's therapist about what equipment might benefit your child and family.



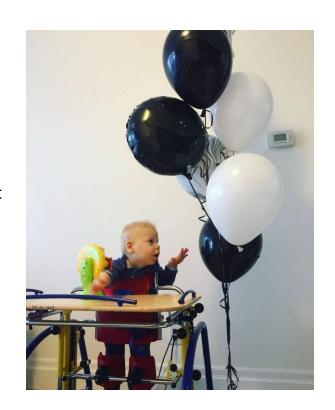
Equipment Categories



Complex Clinical

If your child has a physical disability, your child's therapist may determine that they would benefit from our complex clinical equipment. This equipment is primarily stored at our Barrie and Richmond Hill sites. Complex clinical equipment includes items such as walkers, wheelchairs, standers and adapted chairs. This equipment can be borrowed for long periods of time, up to one year.

Our adapted recreation equipment is a wonderful way for children and youth to join in fun family activities! Recreation equipment is stored and may be picked up at our Barrie and Richmond Hill sites. If your child is involved with an occupational therapist (OT) or physiotherapist (PT), speak to them first about which equipment would be most appropriate for your child.

Eligibility and Process

Recreation equipment can be borrowed by all families who have children and youth with disabilities and developmental needs who live in Simcoe County or York Region. Parents or therapists can contact equipment@ctnsy.ca for more information.

- Once the request for equipment has been received, CTN will notify the family or therapist regarding availability via email. Equipment may be reserved for a future date.
- A liability form will be sent to the therapist/family for completion and acknowledgement of the liability agreement.
- CTN will arrange pick up and drop off time with families at a specific location
- CTN will follow equipment cleaning procedures prior to pick up and after drop off.
- If physical adaptations are required for equipment, please speak to someone on your child's team.
- Families must be able to load and transport the equipment independently.
- Equipment may be borrowed for two weeks.

GRIT Freedom Chair	 Wants to use a chair to access a variety of terrain Fits in a 16" chair or smaller Weighs less than 300 lbs Height between 4'10" and 6'8" 	 A cross between a mountain bike and a chair Disassembles to fit in your vehicle

Angle Oar Paddling System with mount	 Wants an adaptive kayak experience! Is not able to use both arms to paddle Would benefit from a system that decreases effort to paddle and decreases range of motion needed 	 A centralized, rotating head on the support mount stabilizes and holds the weight of the paddle, allowing it to pivot in every direction Attaches to most sit-in and some sit-on-top kayaks Can be used with solo or tandem kayaks
Mobi Chair: Floating Beach Wheelchair	 Loves being on the water! Is child or adult sized. It can be used up to 330 lbs. 	 Must be used with a life jacket Easily moves through sand and other surfaces Disassembles quickly without tools Fits into any vehicle
